WebQuests are inquiry-oriented activities in which most or all of the information used by learners is drawn from the Internet. WebQuest activities are meant to maximize the use of a learner's time on the Internet, focusing on the information itself rather than the search for it. Discovery Education™ *streaming* offers WebQuest content for students to analyze and evaluation tools for educators.

In the Classroom

Activate student creativity and critical-thinking skills by creating a WebQuest for a topic that requires understanding, has Internet resources available, fits curriculum standards, and perhaps has been difficult to teach. Students will analyze various Internet resources, including topic-specific images, encyclopedia articles, and Discovery Education™ *streaming* video segments. Students will be evaluated on their conclusions.

Create A WebQuest

- Step 1 Select a topic appropriate for a WebQuest and build a scenario around the topic, such as bringing contemporary world problems into the classroom, evaluating history, creating products, dealing with life's realities, or sparking students' imaginations.
- Step 2 Create your own design, or utilize one of the many WebQuest templates available on the Internet. Most WebQuests include: an introduction, a task, a description of process, available resources, evaluation, and a conclusion.
- Step 3 Incorporate topic-specific images, encyclopedia articles, Discovery Education™ *streaming* video segments, and other Internet resources into the WebQuest template.
- Step 4 Create an on-line evaluation for students to complete using Discovery Education™ *streaming* Quiz Builder.
- Step 5 Conclude with a summary of the WebQuest. You can include what students have learned and directions for further exploration of the topic.
